Prison

At Woodland Hills Youth Development Center, we have classes each Friday for those who have prayed to receive Christ and for those exploring what being a Christian really means. In addition, we have a worship service each third Sunday night. Also, we hold a worship service the first Tuesday night of each month at Riverbend Maximum Security Prison. The prisoners have their own worship band and several prisoners lead out in preaching and teaching.

Bible Studies

Last month, FBC Nashville started a Bible Sunday School class for the homeless. On the first Sunday there were eight people attending. Last week we had forty in the class. Could God provide 100 homeless in this Sunday School class? We think that He can! All of our other Bible study classes are doing great. I will share some stories in the coming month of how God is changing individual lives.

Food & Clothes

About every week two or three people pray to receive Christ. Our counselors are doing such a fabulous job of presenting the Gospel. FBC Madison has been wonderful as a partner ministry. We are praying about the opportunity to expand our food ministry to a church in East Nashville. We should hear in about a week if this is going to happen. This means we would distribute food and clothes at FBC Madison and food only at the new site. We would have two locations and more opportunities to share Christ.

Homeless

We are disciplining several homeless men who are recruiting people to attend the FBC Nashville Sunday School class. They are learning to share their faith and study their Bibles. We are building many relationships on the streets of Nashville so we can share Christ with those who have the greatest needs.
