

**From Antonius Harris, prisoner and Brother in Christ at Riverbend Maximum Security Prison:**

"I've sent another donation. I know it is not much, but I know God can do just like he did with the fish and the loaves, and take a little and feed a lot. All I have to do is be willing to let go of my little, so God can use it to do a lot. So I just pray that we all have the same willingness as the little boy with the fish and the loaves, and give it to God so he can do above and beyond, with just a little." *Prisoners at Riverbend Maximum Security Prison earn \$0.17 an hour so a \$4-5 donation is a significant amount of work.
